



Climate Ready Trees

This list of trees will thrive in Santa Rosa's current and future climate, as climate change affects Sonoma County. All of the trees on this list are low water use and are eligible for use with the Cash for Grass rebate program.

Common Tree Name	Latin Name	Size*	Notes
California buckeye	Aesculus californica	Medium	Native tree with showy creamy white flowers. Allergenic.
Marina strawberry tree	Arbutus 'Marina'	Medium	Known for reddish peeling bark and orange berries.
Strawberry tree	Arbutus unedo	Small	Edible fruit persists year-round.
Dr. Hurd manzanita	Arctostaphylos manzanita 'Dr. Hurd'	Small	Local native noted for striking mahogany bark and winter bloom. Slow growing.
Ray Hartman ceanothus	Ceanothus 'Ray Hartman'	Small	Native noted for blue spring bloom.
Western redbud	Cercis occidentalis	Small	Native noted for deep pink spring bloom. Slow growing.
Desert willow	Chilopsis linearis	Small	Noted for fragrant, showy flowers spring and summer. Attracts birds.
Persimmon	Diospyros kaki	Small	Heavily fruiting tree.
California Ash	Fraxinus dipetala	Small	This native has small white fragrant flowers.
Crape myrtle	Lagerstroemia indica	Small	Noted for summer flowers and fall color. Attractive bark when mature.
Saratoga laurel	Laurus 'Saratoga'	Small	Leaves used for culinary purposes.
Catalina ironwood	Lyonothamnus floribundus ssp asplenifolius	Medium	Needs excellent drainage, loam or sand.
Swan Hill olive	Olea europaea 'Swan Hill'	Small	This is the only truly fruitless variety.
Little leaf palo verde	Parkinsonia microphylla (Cercidium)	Small	Wide canopy with greenish bark and pale yellow flower.
Chinese pistache	Pistacia chinensis 'Keith Davey'	Medium	Prefer male cultivar for lower maintenance and no pollen production.
Carolina laurel cherry	Prunus caroliniana	Small	Small fragrant white flowers attract bees.
Holly leaf cherry	Prunus ilicifolia	Small	California native. Large clusters of cream colored flowers in the spring.
Pomegranate	Punica granatum	Small	Fruiting tree with beautiful fall foliage.
Majestic Beauty Indian hawthorne	Rhaphiolepis x 'Montic'	Small	Notable for numerous light pink flowers over a long blooming period.
Frontier elm	Ulmus 'Frontier'	Medium	Noted for beautiful mottled bark. Fast growing.
Chinese elm	Ulmus parvifolia ' Drake'	Large	Beautiful tree with weeping habit.

* Approximate tree size at maturity is small (height 25'x width 20'), medium (20' x 40') and large (30' x 60')
