

If you are looking for more ways to save water, are considering replacing your lawn with a drought tolerant landscape, or just need some help choosing plants, we've got you covered. Turn off your Irrigation to Save Water

During this historic drought, the North Bay region has been working hard to save water. This fall, it's especially important that we all continue to conserve and one of the best things we can all do is take a break from outdoor irrigation. Irrigation accounts for approximately 50 percent of



average summertime water use. By turning off your irrigation this fall we can continue to achieve our community-wide 20 percent water savings goal.

In the fall, when it's still warm we may think irrigation is still necessary, but to conserve energy plants go dormant this time of year as they prepare for their winter rest. This means they require little to no irrigation. Whether you water by hand or have an automatic system, let's all commit to turning off outdoor irrigation until Spring. With our region experiencing severe drought conditions it is unknown if our local reservoirs will recover this winter, so we need to make every drop count now.


Water Supply Levels hit Historic Lows



Due to the severity of the current drought, we want to focus on native, drought tolerant landscapes in the Sonoma and Marin areas.




