Eco-Friendly Garden Tour Success!

The 2024 [Eco-Friendly Garden Tour](#) (Tour) was a success! The tour took place on Saturday, May 18th, with over 3,500 attendees visiting 26 gardens throughout Sonoma and Marin counties. Various workshops and events were held at different gardens to promote local landscaping practices. These activities included a California Native Plant Society (CNPS) plant sale, a free compost giveaway, rainwater catchment demos, and the Home Ground Habitat plant and seed sale. The UC Master Gardener Program of Sonoma County hosted a table at the Sonoma Garden Park, showcasing their programs, answering garden-related questions for visitors, and displaying their new water-wise demo garden. Additionally, Santa Rosa Water and Marin Water hosted tables at gardens in their service areas, providing opportunities for attendees to ask questions about various topics and allowing these agencies to promote their landscape programs to residents. The tour also featured three gardens presented by the CNPS Milo Baker Chapter.



We want to thank those who volunteered to be garden hosts and allowed the public to visit their gardens. Thank you also to those who visited the gardens. We hope everyone enjoyed their day, and we look forward to the 2025 Tour.

Water Smart Plants:

Water conservation is an essential consideration when designing and managing Sonoma and Marin County landscapes. Our area has a Mediterranean climate characterized by wet winters and long, dry summers with little rainfall. Plants that are suited or adapted to local conditions not only use less water but generally grow more successfully and robustly, with fewer insect and disease problems. They ultimately create a healthier and sustainable landscape.

We have recently updated the Water Smart Plant Picker tool on our website. New features include updated plant descriptions, printable plant cards (tags) for your garden for each plant, the ability to create a plant list without a login, and better-defined filters. Recognizing 10 Years of the Garden Sense Program:

Garden Sense is a program of the Sonoma-Marin Saving Water Partnership and the UC Master Gardener Program of Sonoma County. Garden Sense

consultants provide support to Sonoma County residents interested in removing lawn, upgrading to efficient irrigation systems, and selecting low water use plants that will thrive in our climate.

Garden Sense consultants provide planting and irrigation advice, resources, and information on available rebate programs so that residents can feel more confident transforming their yards into low water use gardens. Since 2014, Garden Sense consultants have completed nearly 2,000 site visits and saved over an estimated 16 million gallons of water!



Garden Sense was recently presented with a Gold Resolution by the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors, recognizing the work of the Garden Sense consultants over the last ten years.

Water and Energy Efficiency Grant Program:

Sonoma Water, on behalf of the Sonoma-Marin Saving Water Partnership (Partnership), recently launched a regional Drought Resiliency Program. The Drought Resiliency Program was awarded \$2,000,000 from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation's Water and Energy Efficiency Grant Program.

The funding will support water conservation rebate programs offered through the member utilities of the Partnership, which includes the cities of Santa Rosa, Rohnert Park, Petaluma, Sonoma, Cotati, Cloverdale, and Healdsburg, the Town of Windsor, and the North Marin, Marin Municipal, and Valley of the Moon Water Districts.



The program includes funding for rebates to replace lawns with low-water-use plants, high-efficiency clothes washing machines, high-efficiency toilets, smart irrigation controllers, and Flume home water monitoring devices. Additionally, the City of Santa Rosa will implement a high-efficiency fixture direct install program.

Rainwater Rebates Still Available!

Did you know that with just one inch of rain falling on a 1,000 square-foot roof, you could collect 600 gallons of water? By installing a rain barrel or cistern, you can reuse the stored water from the rainy season to water your plants during the spring and summer months.



Rebates vary depending on your location and water provider.
