





Benefits of FIRO:

Forecast-Informed Reservoir Operations (FIRO) is a flexible water management approach that uses data from watershed monitoring, weather, and hydrologic forecasts to help manage reservoir water levels adaptively in response to weather extremes. FIRO represents an innovative application of emerging science and technology to optimize water resources and adapt to changing climate conditions, without costly infrastructure. The key benefits of FIRO include increasing water supply reliability, reducing flood risk, improving resilience to droughts and floods, and optimizing water resource management. Flooding and water supply in the Russian River Basin are largely driven by atmospheric rivers (ARs), so the success of FIRO depends on research to improve AR forecasts.

Our regional water supplies rely on sufficient annual rainfall, which is primarily driven by ARs. The absence of these storms often leads to drought and reduced water supplies for our region, while strong ARs can cause flooding. Sonoma Water manages Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma with FIRO which allows us to adaptively manage the water supply by predicting the timing and intensity of these critical precipitation events. Thanks to FIRO, we have saved nearly 30,000 total acre-feet between both reservoirs in Water Year 2023-2024, equivalent to a small reservoir, without pouring a drop of concrete.

FREE High-Efficiency Plumbing Fixture Packages!

Santa Rosa Water customers may be eligible to receive high-efficiency plumbing fixtures at no cost; up to two replacement high-efficiency toilets, showerheads, and faucet aerators for kitchens and bathrooms. These fixtures are replaced by qualified plumbers that Santa Rosa Water has contracted with.

To be eligible, residents must be served by Santa Rosa Water and the toilets being replaced must be 1.6 gallons-perflush or higher.

Find and Fix Leaks With the DIY Toolkit:

The Do-It-Yourself (DIY) Toolkit is a resource available at Sonoma County Libraries that contains tools to measure and reduce energy and water consumption. You can borrow the toolkit to assess how much energy and water are being used in your home, check for leaks, and identify areas for improvement. Each toolkit has free fixtures, including two low-flow showerheads, faucet aerators, and toilet leak detection tablets.



Additionally, the toolkit provides guidance on making simple upgrades that improve efficiency, lower utility bills, and increase sustainability. It's a cost-effective way to take control of your home's energy and water usage while preventing waste, at no cost!
