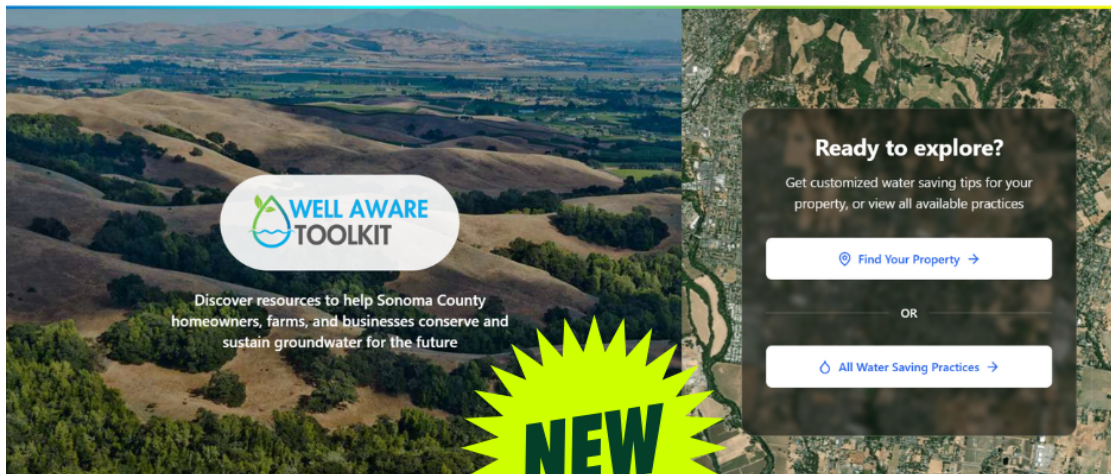
The Well Aware Toolkit is here. Start saving groundwater now!

The Sonoma County Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) are pleased to announce the launch of the [Well Aware Toolkit](#)! This new interactive resource provides personalized water savings tips, programs, and rebates for groundwater users. The resource has guidance for all property types including residential, commercial, vineyards, golf courses, specialty crops, and pasture.

Users can input their own address, and find specific solutions for their property including:

- Customized water-saving strategies for your property
- Financial assistance programs to support water conservation
- Guidance from trusted local experts who understand our region's needs

Groundwater is a critical resource in Sonoma County, supporting families, farms, and ecosystems. About 43,000 people within the groundwater sustainability boundaries and many local jobs in Sonoma County solely rely on groundwater supplies. Preserving this resource is critical to the long-term health of our region. Together, we can protect Sonoma County's groundwater and build a sustainable future.

It's winter! Time to turn off your irrigation:

As we enter the rainy season, it's important that you remember to ensure your irrigation controller is turned off.

Not only is it important that you stop irrigation to protect your plants' health and save water, but it could also save you money.



If your sewer service provider calculates charges based on volumetric rates, then your winter water usage can dictate your sewer bill for the entire year. If your irrigation is left on during this period, you'll be stuck with high rates all year. That's just another reason to turn your irrigation off for the winter!

If you need help programming your irrigation controller or checking for leaks, consider making a free appointment through your water provider to have a technician assist you.

Calling all landscape professionals! Free QWEL Rainwater Catchment Course in Santa Rosa:



Rainwater is a valuable resource that when collected and stored, can be used as an alternative water source helping offset the demand on existing water systems, such as wells, and municipal water.

Water is a precious resource in California and rainwater catchment is one strategy that can help protect this resource.

The purpose of this training, sponsored by the Sonoma-Marín Saving Water Partnership, is to introduce landscape installers and other water system professionals to the basics of rainwater catchment system design and installation.

This class is limited to professionals in Sonoma, Marin, and Mendocino counties.

Find and Fix Leaks With the DIY Toolkit:

Borrow a Do-It-Yourself (DIY) Toolkit from the Sonoma County Libraries to help you conserve water and energy in your home. The Toolkit contains returnable tools like flow rate bags, hot water thermometers, infrared laser thermometers, and others. It also has fixtures you can install for free, including showerheads, faucet aerators, and lightbulbs. The Toolkit even provides the tools necessary for installation!

City of Petaluma Launches Pilot Income Qualified Direct Install Program:

The City of Petaluma is offering free installation for a limited time of ultra-high-efficiency toilets, showerheads, and faucet aerators for qualified residential water customers. A licensed plumber will install these water saving fixtures *for free*:

- 0.8 gallon per flush toilet (2 toilets maximum per household)
- 1.5 gallon per minute showerhead(s)
- 0.5 gallon per minute bathroom sink aerator(s)
- 1.5 gallon per minute kitchen sink aerator

You may be eligible if you:

1. Are a City of Petaluma water customer. Non-property owners must provide written consent from the property owner to be eligible.



2. Have a toilet with a flush rate of 1.6 gallons per flush or higher. The plumber will assess on site if you need upgraded aerators and/or showerheads.
3. Have a household income at or below the moderate income level for Sonoma County.

Explore the history of Lake Sonoma and Warm Springs Dam, learn how water supply and infrastructure are managed, and discover the important partnership between Sonoma Water and USACE (U.S. Army Corps of Engineers).
